

July 28, 2011

These are the minutes of the regular meeting of the Town Council for the Town of Brownsburg, Indiana, held at Town Hall on July 28, 2011 at 7:00 p.m.

Members present: Matt Bowles, Bill Guarnery, Dwayne Sawyer and Dave Richardson.

Also present: Jeanette M. Brickler, Clerk-Treasurer; Grant Kleinhenz, Assistant Town Manager; Tricia Leminger, Town Attorney; Mike Dove, Police Chief; John Depinet, Police Major; Ray Kotarski, Police Commission; Todd Barker, Planning Director; Jon Blake, Planning Tech; and Frank Wise, Building Inspector.

The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and an invocation led by Steve Stone, Chaplain with the Brownsburg Police Department.

Roll call of members present showed that Gary Hood was not present.

There were no comments for the Citizens Comments portion of the July 28, 2011 agenda.

Next on the agenda was approval of consent items. Bill Guarnery moved to approve the memorandum of Executive Session for July 14, 2011, the minutes of the regular meeting of July 14, 2011, the minutes of the special meeting of July 21, 2011 and the Accounts Payable Claims Docket for the Civil Town and Fire Territory for July 15, 2011 through July 28, 2011 in the amount of \$1,945,951.51. The motion was seconded by Dwayne Sawyer and unanimously carried.

The Hendricks County Communications Center was on the agenda for discussion and consideration. Matt Bowles asked that there be a task force of two (2) Council Members to make a recommendation regarding the Center on behalf of the Town of Brownsburg. He further recommended Bill Guarnery and Dave Richardson to the Task Force and they both accepted. Tricia Leminger and Dale Cheatham will draft a letter to the Communications Center Governing Board.

Ordinance #2011-17 Amending Title VII, Chapter 71, Section 71.27(A)(3) of the Brownsburg Town Code Relating to Maximum Lawful Speeds in School Zones was on the agenda for first reading. Dale Cheatham addressed the matter stating the OVB Committee recommendation is to increase the speed limit to 25 mph between the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on school days. Matt Bowles asked if the Council would consider unanimous consent because school will be starting in a couple of weeks. Discussion was held; Dale Cheatham advised the Council that the School Corporation was informed of the plan to change the speed limit, but he received no response. Dwayne Sawyer moved for unanimous consent to approve Ordinance #2011-17. The motion was seconded by Bill Guarnery and unanimously carried. Bill Guarnery moved for 1st, 2nd and 3rd and final reading of the ordinance. The motion was seconded by Dwayne Sawyer and unanimously carried.

Under Reports from Commissions and Boards, Oran True was not present to discuss the Brownsburg Fire Territory Monthly Report.

Mike Dove, Brownsburg Police Chief came before the Council stating his monthly report along with the reports for the Chief of Operations and Chief of Support. He further reported that the department confiscated \$2 Million in marijuana; he added that one of the officers was asked to go to Texas to teach their departments how to detect drugs. Chief Dove went on to inform the Council that there were twenty-four (24) kids in the summer camp the department held and they expect many more next year. The Department had officers attend a conference to learn how to detect the numerous new kinds of crimes.

A CALIA summary page of the recent accreditation was also provided to the Council and the Police Department will be travelling to Cincinnati to receive the award. He added they are proud of Kim Shuppert for the many hours spent collecting the information and documentation. Chief Dove reminded everyone that next Tuesday, August 2, 2011 is the National Night Out Against Crime. The activities begin at 5:00 p.m. and include the motor cycle officers, NHRA and other racing teams, members of the fire department, a concert by Big Daddy Caddy and will provide an opportunity to interact with police and other organizations.

Matt Bowles next read aloud a Proclamation Declaring National Night Out Against Crime in Brownsburg, Indiana on August 2, 2011. He then thanked Bill Guarnery and Dave Richardson for agreeing to be on the HCCC Task Force.

There were no Citizens Comments.

Upon motion made by Bill Guarnery, seconded by Dwayne Sawyer and unanimously carried the meeting was adjourned.

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
