Council Members,

Attached to this report you will find two reports from the Chief of Operations and the Chief of Support Services. I want to highlight a couple of items that were recently discussed at the Police Commission meeting and with staff.

In regards to our reserve recruitment process and our attempts to enlarge our program, we have four reserve candidates currently in the Boone County Reserve Program, who are due to graduate in October. We also have nine additional candidates who will be starting our reserve academy September 18th.

I want the Town Council to be aware that we applied for and received confirmation from the Indiana Law Enforcement Training Board that the Brownsburg Police Department is now certified to host reserve academies at our facility. I also want to make note that we are now only one of two departments in the State of Indiana with this certification.

We just recently completed all operations at Lucas Oil Raceway Park. As you are aware, the event took several days and was postponed several times due to inclement weather. Our executive staff

was on hand and participated in the unified command center operation during the course of these events. We are currently making preparations to prepare for next year's activities at the track.

I will not be in attendance at the next Town Council meeting for my report. However, Major Bullock will be there instead to answer any questions the council may have.


Investigations

The Month of August proved to be busier than normal with the case load average totaling 6.6 per Detective. The unit combined for a total of 12 felony arrests. Personnel within the unit were also assigned to complete Reserve Officer and Full-time applicant backgrounds along with their assigned case load, which totaled 19 backgrounds. Only one background remains to be finalized. The final applicant is scheduled for his interview and CVSA on September 13, 2012.


Detectives investigated a female employee at Brownsburg Meadows nursing home who was responsible for client accounts. She was charged with 22 counts of Class D Felony theft. The accused stole approximately \$2,900 since March of this year from clientele residing at the nursing home.

Detectives cleared up a theft ring occurring at Wal-Mart. Two females and a male were stealing play station games costing thousands of dollars in loss. The ring was targeting local stores in and around Marion County. Investigations was given a Crime Stopper tip, which led to the arrests. This was due to citizens within our community taking an active involvement and utilizing the Facebook Crime Tips developed by our Investigations Unit.


Due to an extensive investigation conducted by Det. Sgt. Jennifer Barrett, a local resident was arrested for the molestation of an eight year old child. He was charged with three Class A felonies and three Class C felonies. The accused is currently incarcerated in the Hendricks County Jail on \$10,000 dollar bond.

Detective Corporal Jeff Klayer assisted Montgomery County Sheriff's department with a fatal motorcycle vs. motor home accident. When summoned, Det. Cpl. Klayer did not hesitate to volunteer his expertise. Cpl. Klayer was the only Accident Re-constructionist available at the time in the surrounding counties and Montgomery County.

So far in 2012, the United Drug Task Force has conducted 29 controlled buys. There have been 22 arrests contributed to these buys from beginning of year to date with additional charges pending. The UDTF continues to operate on grants and forfeitures from cases worked by investigators assigned to the task force. While funding is primarily based on forfeitures, UDTF has received \$14,000 in grant reimbursement and will receive \$11,780 at the end of October. As with many entities, the UDTF is continuously seeking means to lower their operating costs, and one said means is conducting an analysis of costs associated with vehicles operated by personnel of UDTF. Due to the nature of the type of criminal enforcement and need to protect the identity of these said personnel in the conduction of their job assignment while in said vehicles, information will not be disclosed by which means they will lower their costs on vehicles, but it is worth noting that they too are doing their part in preservation of budgets. During the Month of August, Det. Wing closed six cases with four of the cases attached to four Class B felony charges pending on two suspects. UDTF assisted the DEA on a warrant sweep of numerous individuals that were responsible for the trafficking and dealing of thousands of pounds of marijuana per month. Det. Wing also assisted in the surveillance and eradication of a multiple marijuana plant grow-operation.

All personnel of the Investigations Unit successfully completed the state mandated physical tactics training during the month.

During the Month of August, Det. Sgt. Jennifer Barrett was requested by a representative from Children and Family Services with Hope's Voice out of Knox County Teen Court to conduct a social networking, sexting, and internet safety lecture during a conference their agency was hosing. This conference is scheduled for October 5, 2012, of which Det. Barrett has been granted to participate as part of her assignment to ICAC (Internet Crimes Against Children) and responsibilities as a member of our Investigation Division.



Records & Accreditation

During the Month of August, the Records department continued its LaserFiche efforts and was able to complete the scanning of all case reports from the year 2000 prior to their scheduled destruction. This included 1,700 reports and all supplemental documentation. Case reports, with exception to capital crimes, can be destroyed after 10 years of retention in accordance with the Indiana Public Records Commission. As these reports were up for destruction, our department decided it would be valuable to capture the information digitally prior to. We plan to continue this process dating back to 1996 in between daily operations and current projects.

Also in regards to LaserFiche, Records Assistants Angela Seymour, Brenda Habermehl and Mary McGuire achieved their certification in LaserFiche Specialist, with Brenda also completing the LaserFiche Administrator I certification. Kim Shupert was previously certified in both. Kim also completed the I.U.P.U.I. Microsoft Office certificate program. In addition, both Kim and Brenda completed a webinar on policy-writing. All Records employees attended the free Intermediate Word training offered by the Town. The Records department is well-trained, is continually seeking improvement opportunities, and researching innovative methods for record-keeping and public service.

In the Month of August, the Records Department processed 20 public access requests, 11 criminal history requests, 39 gun permit applications, 59 alarm permit transactions, 5 rider requests, and 36 sets of fingerprints. In accordance with ordinance and/or state law, the fees generated by these above listed services totaled the amount of \$2,503.00 for the Month of August. These collected fees have been submitted to the Clerk's office for submission into the General Fund and LECEF (Law Enforcement Continued Education Fund). 

Public Information


The department had 13 media contacts during the Month of August. The contacts covered media releases for an active investigation in which the department was seeking persons and media to get involved to attempt to identify suspects from surveillance videos. In addition to the media releases there were eleven inquiries by media in relation to an infant death investigation from previous months, as well as one media inquiry in reference to a quick change case investigation. Of the 12 media inquiries, 5 of them included an interview conducted by our department Public Information Officer, Det. Sgt. Jennifer Barrett. The department also released 5 Facebook posts, 8 Facebook Crime Tips post, and 3 e-notifies from the website. 
Purchasing/Quartermaster

As of September 1, 2012, the department has expended 63.91% of its budget. Staff continues to work diligently to monitor expenditures and maintain monthly documentation for review by Executive Staff and Purchasing Agent to ensure budgets are on track. Department 2013 budget has been submitted and pending review from Town Council for approval or revision.



Information Technology

As reported last month, the new mobile data terminals have been imaged by Lt. Depinet, and are waiting deployment. Once the town garage is ready, the install will involve 11 units being deployed, which will replace the current aging mobile data terminals (MDT) that require regular routine maintenance. Our department is currently testing the VieVu wearable video camera in the field. Once the evaluation is complete the Product Committee is expected to choose between the VieVu and the Taser Camera. Both units should provide great quality and functionality at a fraction of the cost of the current units we have been purchasing in years past. At the direction of Major Grimes, Lt. Depinet has begun to modify our time-tracking database to prepare for the tracking of time for the Lucas Oil Raceway Park in 2013. Once upgraded, the reporting of hours will be easily generated and seamless with our current pay process. The Police Department has launched the iPhone/iPad application for LaserFiche. Now administrative users will have 24/7 access to our documents by simply using their phones. This will benefit the detectives the most since it will give them the ability to search suspect information within our LaserFiche database. They will also be able to take pictures in the field and import them directly into the electronic case file.



Human Resources



At the August Police Commission Meeting, Chief Dove presented certificates of commendation and Chief's coin to Officer Josh O'Brien, Officer Grant Anderson, and Det. Joe Fults for their involvements in investigating burglaries that occurred during the Month of July. Officer Anderson and O'Brien conducted countless hours of investigation both on and off duty, to identify and apprehend suspects from local burglaries. Det. Fults played an

integral part in both O'Brien and Anderson's investigation, as well as aided in the apprehension of yet another burglar from a case investigated by Cpl. David Pyatt during the Month of July as well. It is this level of dedication, teamwork, networking, and skills that make such acts commendable and pertinent to receive such recognition.

The department has finalized the 2012 Reserve Officer Recruitment process, in which all nine officers that were extended an offer to attend the 2012 Reserve Officer Academy have accepted. The Brownsburg Reserve Officer Academy class is set to begin on September 18, 2012. Prior to completion of the Reserve Academy, each candidate will have to complete a physical and psychological evaluation. Once completed with the academy and final requirements, these nine candidates will then be requested to receive a conditional officer as Reserve Police Officer by the Brownsburg Police Commission. In addition, the department has re-initiated the full-time process based upon the established hiring list that our agency has had in place. A number of personnel at the top of the hiring list have been notified and background investigations/CVSA has been taking place in accordance with the phases of the process. This is in response to the need for replacing an officer that resigned from our agency this year, and is by no means an expansion of personnel. The full-time process is scheduled to be completed prior to year end.

Training

The Brownsburg Police Department had set a goal for 2012 of obtaining certification by the Indiana Law Enforcement Training Board (AKA ILEA-Indiana Law Enforcement Academy) for the 2012 Brownsburg Police Reserve Academy. This was a time consuming task given to our Training Coordinator, Sgt. Andy Watts, in submitting proper documentation (i.e. request, lesson plans, instructor bios etc.) to ILEA to initiate the process. It is with great pleasure that we share with all that as of August 20th, ILEA has

granted our request and has designated this year's academy as a Certified Reserve Officer Academy training site. This is the first time in our agency's history that a reserve academy has been certified and is currently 1 of 2 agencies statewide conducting a certified reserve academy. Currently 16 recruits are confirmed to attend the upcoming academy from various agencies. It is the intention to file for said certification for each Reserve Officer Academy class that our agency hosts from this point forward. In announcing the hosting of the 2012 Reserve Academy class, Sgt. Watts received the below email from Zionsville Police Department which testifies to the quality of instruction our personnel are providing to not only our officers, but to all of those from other entities that attend our training programs:

"Andy

Thank you so much for thinking of us in the upcoming reserve academy. At this time we will not have any reserve candidates to put in. I am so happy with the quality of your academy and so impressed by the Brownsburg Police Department in general. I wish I had some reserve candidates to put in but with 6 reserve candidates currently in the Boone County reserve academy we will be scrambling to get all of them through FTO during the time frame. Please keep us in mind for your next one.

Emergency Response Team

During the Month of August, members of the Brownsburg Emergency Response Team conducted a candidate selection process (i.e. firearms, interview, fitness testing, etc.). This process was initiated for the anticipated replacement of a member resigning this year, and in hopes of establishing an eligibility list of personnel for a designated period of time; however, at the time of this process only one person submitted for said position. At the time of this report, the selection process is still on-going with an expected completion date in September.

Also during the month, ERT conducted it regularly scheduled monthly training. Training included open area searches utilizing tactical formations and movement. In addition, gas mask training was conducted with exposure to CS less lethal munitions during tactical exercises. On Thursday, August 23, 2012, at approximately 1800 hours, Detective Sgt. Jennifer Barrett and Sgt. Tim Wells requested the assistance of the Brownsburg Emergency Response Team in the apprehension of a subject wanted on several 'A' Felony Child Molest charges and additional 'C' Felony offenses. Circumstances exceed the required points system on the Warrant Service Risk Assessment Matrix based upon crimes committed, criminal history, may require forced entry, weapons accessible to suspect, and there being an attack pit-bull and numerous persons residing at residence. The scene was secured by ERT with no damages to property and no injuries to the suspect or dog.


August 2012 OPERATIONS REPORT

ENFORCEMENT

During the Month of August, the officers of the Enforcement Division worked a total of 3894 hours, with 36 of those hours being completed by Probationary Officers currently in the Field Training Program (FTO). While 186 hours of the total hours worked were completed by Reserve Officers not in the FTO program, 306 hours of the total hours were worked by Traffic Units (Motorcycle Personnel), and 161 hours of the total hours were worked by Interdiction Officers.



INTERDICTION:

On August 22, 2012, members of the Brownsburg Police Department I.C.E. Team conducted a traffic stop on the interstate while working a detail for Homeland Security Investigations (H.S.I.). Officers stopped a vehicle coming from Toledo, OH en route to Houston, TX and became suspicious of the 3 occupants due to overly nervous behavior and conflicting stories for the nature of the trip. Officers received consent to search the vehicle and found several duct taped packages hidden down below the gear shifter molding in the center console area of the vehicle. Inside the packages was over \$75,000.00 worth of high end jewelry such as Rolex watches and other fine gold pieces and watches. The jewelry is suspected to be a result of residential burglaries in the Toledo, OH area. Officers released the 3 subjects after collecting fingerprints and pictures of all 3 subjects. We will make every attempt to find owners of the property before auctioning the property to the public. At this time, there are no known owners and all 3 subjects denied ownership of the hidden jewelry.

MOTORCYCLE:

The month of August was a busy month for the motor unit. Officer Rooker returned back to duty from his injury that kept him off work for the month of July. We focused on the school zones in the early part of the month to show awareness to all drivers that kids are back in school and that they need to pay closer attention when traveling through these areas. BCSC Police Chief Ginnie Wing thanked us for our efforts, stating they are busy inside the schools and can't focus on the vehicle traffic like the motor unit can. Now that school has been in for a month we are periodically roaming the school zones. Drivers recognize that we are around and for the most part pay attention to their speeds.

We had several special details for the month:

- **8/11 Handicapable motorcycle ride**
- **8/24 The Duncan Wedding (Special Request) motorcycle ride.**

(Pat Duncan is a town employee who hosts the Hoosier Burn Camp motorcycle ride every year. He asked the unit if we would assist him with an escort of about 40 motorcycles to Crawfordsville, IN where his wedding reception took place. The unit agreed to this request due to the good that Mr. Duncan brings to the Hoosier Burn Camp.)

8/30 John Force Car Show

Training took place in Columbus, IN at the Columbus Airport on August 27th. This training consisted of 11 motor officers and from 5 different agencies. As a motor instructor this was an exciting opportunity for good training. Cpl. West was able to introduce himself as an instructor and work one on one with several officers. The plan going forward is that each instructor will have a day to instruct on a topic of their choosing. Not only will this provide experience for instruction as we move forward with teaching a basic class, it will also provide excellent skills training to the motor officers already certified.

September looks just as busy as August was but we look forward to seeing what it brings.

FLEET:



The garage is still in the process of transitioning equipment from old vehicles to the new.

One of the dedicated Reserve vehicles, a 2005 Crown Vic, was involved in a single car crash as the vehicle was traveling in heavy rain that caused it to hydroplane and leave the roadway on I-74. The officer was not injured but the vehicle was totaled by the insurance company due to its age. The claim was for \$6678 minus \$1000 for deductable and \$450 for salvaged title fees which makes the Town due \$5228. The department paid \$2500 for the vehicle.
